D. PUBLIC COMMENT

Joan K. White, 7429 W. Winona: Last night a Committee of the Whole meeting was held for the village board members. The Mayor was not there, but Trustee Dobrzycki did a fine job chairing the meeting.

This was a long but very productive meeting because everybody around the table seemed to listen carefully and then participated by asking many questions, giving thoughts and suggestions about the budget amounts they were projecting. Every person there, Trustees, Departments Heads and the Village Accountant all realized the very serious nature of the problem; that without very drastic, unpleasant cuts, there probably would be little or no cash left in the bank by next April 30th. They also knew that even though they agreed to many cuts yesterday, this still would not be enough to produce a balanced budget and further work would be needed.

It took a lot of courage for this group to tackle this reality, but they came together, working line by line, page by page, without once pointing a finger or trying to pin blame on any one particular individual. They just kept on working for a good 3 hours.

The trustees who led the various committee discussions were excellent in their delivery of facts. Trustee Szlendak, Trustee Jezierny, Trustee Schuepfer all came well prepared with back-up data to answer questions that were posed. Everyone there seemed to contribute his best efforts to try to meet this unprecedented challenge.

Even though the Appropriation Ordinance is still not completed, I believe that all who attended yesterday's meeting should be complimented for their contributions. I personally felt that I was witnessing a combined group effort, the likes of which I have not seen for a long time. It was good to see, good to hear.

Roy Schmidt, 4336 N. Rutherford: Having been involved with the vote for the Clock Towers over there, I know that much of it has been sold, I understand and everything. One of the issues we talked about when we were voting on the Clock Towers we were assuming some Harwood Heights residents would move into that building. I'm just curious if we know how many Harwood Heights residents, if any, have moved into that building? There's a rumor going around that some people from the Courtyard's in fact, are moving to that building. I know it's not a question and answer, but maybe later on you can give me an answer, I'm just curious if it is in fact true that some people are moving into the Clock Tower's?

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E. REPORTS OF MAYOR, TRUSTEES, CLERK AND ATTORNEY

Mayor's Report

Mayor Fuller

I will answer that right off the bat; the transfer fees, change of property are just starting to come in now, so we don't have any real numbers; but I know for a fact, a woman who was recently widowed has purchased one and my neighbor across the street's daughter who just got married, they purchased one, a young couple. So, I know there are many Harwood Heights residents that are interested in that property. But I can get you as they come in, I can get you a better update.

Last week Trustee Dobrzycki and I attended the Northwest Municipal Conference Annual Meeting in Skokie. It was very informative. As a member of the Legislative Committee, I am currently on call for all legislation that is pending in Springfield. We were able to talk with many officials from other towns about issues that we all face such as redevelopment and budgets.

The History Walk netted \$3,661.54 so we will be presenting a check in the amount of \$1,830.77 to both the Senior Assistance Center and West Suburban Special Recreation Association in the near future. The walk photos are now on the village web site along with a photo of the new board on the photo history page. An evening session is planned for the 60th anniversary photos on July 11th, so please join us then if you haven't had your photo taken yet.

A Committee of the Whole meeting was held on June 19th to review the 2007 projects with the consulting engineers scheduled to oversee the work. Hancock Engineering talked about their proposal for the 2007 MFT projects, which include Odell Avenue from Foster to Carmen and from Carmen to Argyle; and Argyle from Oconto to Harlem, also included is various sidewalks as have been reported to the village. If approved tonight, the engineering and the work will be paid with MFT funds already available. Later at the meeting Christopher Burke Engineering spoke about their proposals to be the project manager for the Lawrence Avenue Streetscape and also to do the engineering for the Lawrence Avenue water main, the construction observation may be done in house, if the Superintendent of Public Works has the time available at that time. The water main has been held up due to the location of utilities and some redesign is necessary. If the agreements get approved tonight hopefully we can expect the water main to be done this fall and I will schedule a meeting about the Lawrence Avenue Streetscape project as soon as we get IDOT approval. We are hoping for a winter letting for the streetscape project.

The engineers were selected based on an ordinance pre-qualifying several engineering firms. It should be noted that Illinois state law requires selection of professional services based on the Local Government Professional Services Selection Act which requires Qualification Based Selection. I'd also like to add that is very obvious how much work our staff engineer was doing for us and how much money he was saving the village besides all the grant money he brought in. Going back to consulting engineers will end up costing the village more in the long run. The motions for the engineering are items I 6, I 7, I 8, I 9, and I 10.

Police Officer Sam Palazzo participated in the week long PACT Camp given by the Cook County Sheriff's Youth Services Department. The Police Department picked four young children from Union Ridge School all residents of Harwood Heights and they attended the camp with Sam Palazzo last week. The camp is designed to put youth and law enforcement personnel together in a cooperative setting that will strengthen bonds between youth and police, and to provide recreational activities that are fun, healthy and "community positive." In addition, the camp strengthens the presence of the local Police Department in the community, sometimes providing a needed bridge between families and services. Camp activities focus on resiliency factors that strengthen a sense of autonomy, feelings of personal efficacy, heightened self-esteem and a belief in the possibilities of the future. Community service projects reinforce caring and empathy for others. Team-building activities not only help the campers learn to work with others; leadership skills, cooperation, communication and other valuable skills are reinforced. This camp is provided at no cost to the community; it is completely paid for by the Cook County Sheriff's Youth Services.

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Chief Podosek contacted Plaza Bank requesting a public donation from their banking institution to cover the cost of a new MPH Mobile Speed Sign that he purchased for increased traffic enforcement. He received a telephone call from Mr. Ken Meyer, President of Plaza Bank & Trust Company regarding the request. The MPH Mobile Speed Sign actually cost \$10,500.00 but Chief Podosek was able to negotiate the price down to \$5,200.00; Plaza Bank has graciously offered to donate \$5,000.00 to the Village of Harwood Heights to cover the cost of this piece of equipment. We would like to recognize Mr. Ken Meyer and Penelope from Plaza Bank tonight and thank him for their generous donation. We are very pleased that Mr. Ken Meyer and Plaza Bank chose to make this contribution to the traffic enforcement for the benefit of our whole community. I'd like to ask Mr. Meyer and Penelope to come up to the front for a photo with the Police Chief.

Our Director of Administration, Larry Noller, is working with staff to get all the water meters read hopefully next week, we are trying some later hours so that we can get the customers who are not home during the day, hopefully this will help diminish the possible water discrepancies. Public Works moved a hydrant on the 7600 block of Lawrence due to too many water breaks, where the ground was actually sunk in, this should improve the situation in that area.

Participating in the Illinois Department of Transportation's Roadside Safety Check, the Police will be conducting the check this weekend, from 10 p.m. Friday to 3 a.m. Saturday at Harlem and Lawrence Avenues. Once again they will be stopping every 5th car and checking for valid drivers' license, proof of insurance, and proof of registration. These safety checkpoints are expected to reduce alcohol related fatalities and save lives.

I am pulling motion I 2 for a separate vote; I believe the motion should be tabled until the appropriation ordinance is adopted or until at least the Finance Committee gives their final recommendations for the ordinance. As I said at the last meeting, we are spending money without an appropriation in place; the board tabled the much needed new software, yet continues to spend money in other departments without an ordinance in place. So to be fair and unbiased, and not political, this motion should also wait to be considered in a few weeks. The Finance Committee has not yet made a recommendation to the board regarding this fiscal year's appropriation ordinance. It must be adopted before July 31st and a public hearing must be held. I am pleased to continue to report that last year's budget although un-audited, continues to show revenue in excess of expenditures of over \$1.3 million dollars, so we not only had a balanced budget but did not spend the revenue from the sale of the old Village Hall.

I wish everyone a happy and safe 4th of July and remember to take precautions if you use any fireworks and know what is legal and illegal. I believe the Chief put safety information and the code on the village website regarding fireworks.

Information/Technology

Information and Technology Committee Report: Yesterday evening a Committee of the Whole Meeting was called to review village finances and plan for the upcoming year's appropriations. In this budgeting process attention was paid to many items, including the planned efforts to update and modernize our village office's work environment through new software and programs. Larry Noller, our Director of Administration, stressed the importance of this project in creating greater efficiency within the work staff. More information with greater detail could be recorded, sorted, compared and analyzed to make informed decisions on the many choices and projects the board and administration have to make, and to make them wisely and with the most benefit and value for each dollar spent for the village.

The Municipal Software, Inc. software package for the village was chosen based on a thorough review including the input of village staff over the past several months and is proposed to integrate the Village's financial and administrative functions. As I mentioned at the previous board meeting, MSI gave a special presentation on May 16th to fellow trustees who asked many questions about its functionality. The board was very impressed with the software and presentation. The software is very important because it allows a comprehensive approach to our network and storage systems that permit fast and dependable access.

NABTECH has given an exceptional price on a new server for use with the new software and Mr. Noller has spoken with MSI who have offered concessions to the village to make the change over less financially difficult.

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The basic theory here is that with the new system and software we can not only save time and money in the long term but in the short term as well. More can be done in less time, and with the information we have we can make more critical choices and decisions that save more money for the village.

Because of our new scanner and software capability, we now have the ability to post village ordinances on-line on the village's website. I believe Trustee Schupfer will speak about that as well. As I discovered, you can search using a word to find an ordinance title. Hopefully with our current technologies and future upgrades we will be able to store the documents as PDF's - Portable Document files - and allow for searches using key words within the documents, that would make it helpful for doing more in-depth research.

Forestry/Recreation

On behalf of the Forestry and Recreation Committees: Tom Schroeder and the Public Works crew have been keeping very busy cutting down trees, branches, trimming trees and removing dead ones. Also, Hendrickson has also been doing a lot of tree trimming, cutting down branches and also cutting down and removing branches that are too tall or too high up for our Public Works to cut down themselves.

On behalf of the Harwood Heights Youth Commission, I would like to announce that Mary Pelarenos, coordinator, will be starting a Soccer Program towards the end of July, the tentative dates are set for July 28th through September 8th. The Soccer Program will be open for boys and girls, ages 5 to 12; they'll be split into two sessions and the fee will be \$20 for residents and \$25 for non-residents. If anyone is interested or need more information, please contact the Village Hall or myself.

Public Works
Trustee Jeziorny

The Public Works crew continues the Hot Patching of streets throughout the Village. If anyone notices any pot holes in streets or alleys, please bring this to the attention of our village office.

The Mayor somewhat brought us up-to-date on the Street and Sidewalk projects as requested of her at the last Board meeting. However, we still await the proposed Sidewalk listing to-date. The two Engineering firms selected by the Mayor were present: Hancock Engineering and Burke Engineering. As a result of this meeting, some cost-savings were negotiated with Burke Engineering on their Project Management Agreement for the Lawrence Ave Streetscape which is Motion I-10 on tonight's agenda. The Trustees also agreed to have our Superintendent Tom Schroeder inspect the Water Main project which also would result in a significant savings of almost \$30,000. Superintendent Schroeder had already been involved with the continuing inspection of Phase I of the Water Main project that had occurred through the Value City parking lot which connected to the main water main over at Harlem Avenue. He also recently inspected the Sewers at the Clock Tower development.

What concerns me is that Tom Schroeder's appointment as Superintendent has not been renewed by the Mayor. His appointment ends June 30th and today is June 28th. I suggest he be reappointed for 2 years; the same period that all other appointees, as his performance and involvement in Sewers, Water, Forestry, maintenance of lighting, roadways and alleys are valuable to this village.

Also on the agenda, is Motion I-2 which is for the rental of snow equipment; this equipment has been rented for the past 4-5 years for the purpose of snow removal from alleys. There has been no increase in cost for this equipment since the program began. However, I do agree with the Mayor that we should be pulling this item, as I was contemplating in doing, because until we are finished with our appropriation budget to know exactly where our spending needs are going to go, that would be beneficial. But, at the same time I also believe that we should do cost cutting without sacrificing the services to the residents in our community.

Last night, a Committee of the Whole meeting took place pertaining to Public Works, Finance and Ordinances. The committee generated a lot of discussion over our financial status and focused on significant cost-cutting measures. As chairperson of Public Works, I recommended that our MFT grant fund be audited by the State as this has not occurred

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for years. In the interim our Account, Martin Boyd has been keeping track of expenses in this fund, as expenses against it occur. So, I congratulate Martin on keeping it somewhat up to date.

I want to first thank the Mayor, Clerk Larson and Larry Noller; if you'll recall at the last meeting when we were talking about the Ordinance Committee recommendations, we brought to the Mayor the request that there would be an interim way to post ordinances that had not been posted to LexusNexus, since it only happens once a year. The Mayor, Clerk Larson and Larry Noller jumped right on it and if you have a chance, please do go to the village website and click on the village code and you'll notice that all of the ordinances that have been passed since January are now part of the website, so that the residents can in fact go to the website and look at those particular ordinances, just in case you're not collecting them at each meeting.

We did in fact meet as part of the Committee of the Whole last night; we have two ordinances pending. One is the ordinance on the impound fee and currently the Mayor is working with our attorneys in creating a draft. The second ordinance that is under review or under the creation of a draft, is that we discussed the possibility of creating an ordinance that would allow businesses who in fact wanted to permit smoking for the last six months of this year before the implementation of Smoke-Free Illinois as a possibility. So, we are asking that that draft be forwarded to the attorney for review, so that we can discuss it as a full board.

First of all I would like to thank Joan White for a wonderful report on yesterday's meeting. A couple of things I would like to add to it; Trustee Dobrzycki and Trustee Mougolias were there, they were very well prepared and their input was extremely valuable. I would also like to thank the Chief for coming up with additional information for us for the impound fee ordinance that will generate approximately \$250,000 annually. Also, especially the Chief and Tom Schroeder, the Superintendent of Public Works, they really cut their budget and I greatly appreciate their input; bottom line, we're \$700,000 lower in our budget estimate then we were the day before yesterday.

I understand that we're all anxious in getting the appropriation done, the unfortunate part is that we are right now, a couple of days ago we were at \$2.5 million in the hole, we were able to take \$700,000 in budget cuts plus \$250,000 in additional revenue, so we decreased our numbers by 1 million dollars and we still have 1.5 million dollars to tackle. It takes time, I mean we have to be very, very creative and I'm sorry that some of the meeting that we had we did not have an adequate number of trustees so we had to postpone it; but we'll get it done. It's not going to be pleasant but it will get done.
