Norway maple: Medium to fast growing, difficult to grow grass under because of shade, mostly insect and disease free.



Swamp White oak Majestic tree, slow in growth. Planted for future generations. difficult to start, but well worth it after they are established.



Little leaf linden Cone shape, has problems with Japanese beetle, good shade tree, no diseases



Hornbeam - small shade tree, a good street tree



Ginkgo : Great yellow fall color. No insects or diseases



Hackberry : An excellent shade tree. Corky bark. No diseases or insect problems to worry about.



Autumn blaze maple: A cross between red and silver maples, fast growth, lovely autumn colors. No sewer problems, at least that I know of. (nice disclaimer)



Honey locust tree - Vase shape, small leaves, tolerates just about everything including neglect. Some insect problems, but manageable.



Cleveland Pear: It naturally grows in a tight, symmetrical shape. A semi-perfect oval. Its leaves fill in any gaps creating a near flawless surface area.



Green Vase Elm. A medium to large deciduous tree, shape, clean foliage, attractive bark and resistance to Dutch elm disease
