Work in Progress

The Oriole Detention Project on Oriole from Strong to Carmen for storm detention will also include an 18" storm sewer down the 7500 block of Strong from Oriole just past Olcott. Residents in the area have been notified and will be advised to move cars when needed.

The work down the center of Strong Street should take about 2 weeks and the center will be patched for the winter until Spring when the entire street will be paved.

Work on Oriole will follow and includes "Storm Traps" to be installed from Strong to Argyle. Once installed the street will be temporarily paved until Spring.

Storm traps will also be installed from Argyle to Carmen in the Spring due to supply of materials.

When work commences on Oriole, traffic will be prohibited and proper notifications will be forthcoming.

Harwood Heights Police Department Awarded Illinois Department of Transportation Traffic Enforcement Grant

This grant allows our Police Department to conduct additional traffic safety efforts with a strategy to reduce traffic crashes and help in saving lives. The mission is to educate drivers on risks associated with dangerous driving behaviors. Additional enforcement will be focused on speeding, impaired driving, distracted driving, failing to yield, and disobeying traffic control devices.

This grant is from October 1st, 2023 to September 30th, 2024.
